Ofsted/Holidays

Kelly explained Ofsted rules - first 5 days of September Ofsted will not visit

Parents can be fined the first 3 weeks of September if they take their child/ren out for a holiday – new guidelines from the Government. This is why the school made the decision to have 5 days and not return until 10th September, if we came back for 2 days then the Local Authority could issue a penalty notice to those parents whose children have not returned due to a holiday.

Messages from Post box

Letter was received stating a few points of concern:

Claire Barker read the letter:

NITS - Parent complained about their child constantly having problems with 'Nits' and would like the school to address this more by explaining to parents how to prevent this or how to treat a child when they have them

Unofficial Facebook page – parent stated if the page is 'unofficial' and not 'monitored' then parents wish for this not to be discussed and screenshotted and given to staff at BCPS as they feel this is unfair and underhand if it is not related to the school.

Miss Stock said she had tried to meet with the parent on a number of occasions to discuss this but they have cancelled due to personal reasons. The parent has now emailed to say they are pleased with how 'lice' is now being dealt with.

Kaylee Seymour read another letter:

Inset Days – parents raised an issue with the inset days in September 2018 – for non-working parents this is ideal but unfortunately for working parents and parents who have 1 child at BCPS and another at ORA it means parents now have to cover 8 weeks over the summer period as ORA break up a week earlier and BCPS return a week later and this is simply a nightmare as some parents have no allocated leave left to book any time off.

Maths & Homework issues – parent raised an issue in KS2 that no Maths homework is being handed to the children (Y5) – parent feels their child is now not receiving any homework and that at the age the child is at he doesn't know his times tables. Mrs Harris raised concern that her child had only received 1 piece of homework since September.

- ACTION Miss Stock said she would investigate and this would be followed up
 Mr Russ has now spoken to the children top find out if homework is being set across KS2 It is
- Mr Russ has confirmed Y5 are now receiving SATs arithmetic papers instead to prepare for Year 6.

Few issues from the last meeting - End of school day arrangements

- There are still a few parents for KS2 who are turning up early for drop-off and pick up to collect/drop-off children – this is becoming congested at the front of the school as parents are all crowing round the black gates – (JH & CB feel it has improved)
 - ACTION reminder of times to parents and not to arrive too early
- Parents raised issue that KS2 children are not being released at 3.15pm when they should be and on a few occasions have been coming out of school gone 3.20pm.
 - ACTION reminder to KS2 staff to release at the correct times
- Mrs Harris had a private message regarding the reception gate requesting maybe they could be opened earlier than the rest so that it isn't so chaotic for reception children and also Treetops parents
 - ACTION speak with reception teachers
- Mrs Seymour suggested coning off the area by the black gates to stop parents crowding round

Attendance Awards

Parent raised a concern regarding their child having had medical appointments and their child worrying about not receiving an attendance reward

 ACTION - Miss Stock to make children aware not to worry about their attendance being affected if they have a medical issue as we always take this into consideration

Aggressive Behaviour Policy

The policy has been amended and Miss Stock asked Parent Forum to make sure they are happy with the wording – specifically about use of social media and the right to change school if unhappy.


