### School Uniform

The majority of children look smart in their school uniform but unfortunately for some it has slipped recently. From September we will be sending home notes when the uniform is not correct, so to bear this in mind when buying uniform for September, this includes shoes, socks, hair decorations etc. Thank you for your cooperation, uniform helps identify us as a school family and supports high standards and expectations in all areas of school life.

All children need to adhere to our uniform policy, a copy of which is available on request or is downloadable from the school website.

All children should be wearing black shoes or black trainers, laces must be black and not multi-coloured. Please ensure that your child has named PE kit in school, black shorts and a white t-shirt, with plimsolls for indoor PE and trainers for outdoor PE that fit. Dresses should be pink and of a checked material.


### Uniform

- White blouse, shirt or polo shirt (logo optional)
- School tie (optional)
- Grey skirt or pinafore dress
- Grey trousers or shorts
- Pink checked dress (Summer)
- Mid grey sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan (logo optional)
- White or grey ankle socks
- Grey tights
- Black shoes or trainers (visible brand logos are not acceptable)

### Hair

- Long hair should be tied back with small black, grey or pink hair ties. Decorative hair bands are not acceptable (e.g. flowers, bows etc.)
- Boys and girls must secure hair back from the face for all physical activity.
- Extreme haircuts are not permitted including shaven heads, Mohicans and tramlines or other designs.
